### **How To Get CLEP Credit**

When you take a CLEP exam, you can select one institution to receive your scores. Select **South Arkansas Community College** to have your scores sent here. A required score of **50** must be made in order to receive credit for a course. An official score report will automatically be forwarded to the college selected. You will also receive an unofficial copy of your score for your records immediately after the examination (except for College Composition which takes 2 to 3 weeks).

If a college is not indicated, a transcript can be requested at a later time for \$30. Submit a Transcript Request Form available at clep.collegeboard.org.

# What to Bring on Exam Day

Bring Registration Ticket with voucher number, testing fee receipt, and two (2) forms of identification to the Testing Center. Primary ID must include valid photo and signature (ex. a driver's license or passport). Secondary ID must have a signature and/or photo (ex. a social security card or student ID). Student/college ID cards are acceptable only as a secondary form of identification.

Nothing is allowed during the exam except for scratch paper and pencil. All personal belongings must be stored. A calculator will be provided, if allowed. Each exam lasts approximately two hours. Please plan accordingly. Candidates with disabilities who require accommodations must make arrangements well in advance of the testing date.

# Earn College Credit for What You Already Know

The College-Level Examination Program® (CLEP®) provides the opportunity to earn college credit for what you already know with a qualifying score of 50 or higher. These exams test your knowledge of introductory college-level subjects. There are **no** CLEP exams for any of the Basic Studies courses.

There are a total of 36 CLEP exams and South Arkansas Community College provides credit for successful scores on 23 CLEP exams. The following table lists the exams for which credit is granted and SouthArk's equivalent course.

# Important Information About Our CLEP Policy

Students may earn between 3 and 4 credits on each CLEP exam. Students may not repeat an exam of the same title within 3 months of the initial testing date. If an exam is retaken within the 3 month waiting period, the exam will be considered invalid, the score will be canceled, and any testing fee will be forfeited.

Twelve (12) hours of credit must be completed at South Arkansas Community College before students may petition for CLEP credits to be posted to their transcript.
