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Program Description	The PN program is designed to prepare the successful graduates, who pass the NCLEX-PN licensure exam, to provide safe nursing care, in a variety of health care environments, for patients across the lifespan. The Day program begins in the summer semester (May) and concludes in May (3 semesters).
Program Requirements	49 TOTAL Program credit hours. Completion of all remediation requirements; Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00; All prerequisite courses must be completed with grade of 'C' or better prior to program entry (GPA in prerequisite courses = min. of 2.00); May be enrolled in only three of the four prerequisite courses in the semester that immediately precedes program entry; Students admitted to the program are not allowed to take any non-program courses concurrently while in the program. Application required; Selective admission; Applicants will be selected based on a point system derived from a combination of cumulative GPA, prerequisite GPA, and TEAS scores. TEAS requirements: See <a href="https://www.southark.edu/academics/health-science/teas-exam;">https://www.southark.edu/academics/health-science/teas-exam;</a> TEAS results must be delivered by student to nursing dept. on day of testing; Selected students must pass a criminal background check and drug screen and are required to have all immunizations, vaccinations, testings, & screenings required by clinical facilities. After successful completion of all program courses (grade of 'C' or higher in all program courses), graduates will be eligible to register for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX). Graduation from the practical nursing program does not automatically enable the graduate to sit for the NCLEX-PN. Eligibility to take the NCLEX-PN is dependent on meeting standards in the Arkansas State Board Nurse Practice Act and Laws and Rules (or the standards of the Nursing Board in the state for which the graduate intends to apply for licensure). Graduation from the program does not ensure that the graduate will pass the NCLEX-PN licensure exam or be granted a license by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing.
Career Opportunities	Nurses evaluate patients and record their findings, keep records of their symptoms and progress, administer medications and help instruct the family in proper health care. Career opportunities are wide and varied and include, but are not limited to, employment in hospitals, clinics, schools, industry, and many other areas providing direct or indirect care to diverse patients as well as various other fields that do not include patient care.
